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I. METHODOLOGY FOR EVALUATING THE QUALITY ASSURANCE PROCESS IN PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS

A high-quality higher education system is a categorical imperative for a country to realise its vision and achieve its goals. The policy for strengthening quality within the Cameroonian university system has been observable since its alignment with the Bachelor-Master-Doctorate (BMD) system. According to the New Law 2023/007 of July 25, 2023, regarding the orientation of Higher Education in Cameroon, Quality Assurance refers to a "process targeting the strategies, actions, and attitudes necessary to guarantee the maintenance and improvement of quality" (Art. 8). To ensure its implementation, the Ministry of Higher Education, through the Department of University Accreditations and Quality (DAUQ), is responsible for:

- The Ministry's general policy regarding accreditation and quality assurance, in liaison with the National Standards Agency;
- The production of standards for teaching and research; - Defining the rules and principles for developing curricula, as well as for the creation and opening of training institutions, schools, study programmes, academic departments, and training cycles;
- The production of evaluation and certification standards for training institutes, institutions, study programmes, academic departments, and training cycles;
- Defining evaluation criteria for lecturers, teaching activities, and training institutes.
- Participating in the production of standards for academic and social infrastructure, as well as teaching and learning equipment;
- Defining guidelines for governance and ethics;
- Producing frameworks for the validation of prior learning and research outputs;
- Standardising academic evaluations;
- Developing performance indicators for university institutions and for the comparability of university systems;
- Maintaining and analysing evaluation reports of Higher Education institutions prepared by specialised accredited bodies;
- Evaluating and validating foreign training and professional development certificates.

Therefore, in accordance with the statutory missions listed above, and with the high authorisation of the Minister of State, Minister of Higher Education, Chancellor of Academic Orders, Prof. Jacques Fame Ndongo, an external Quality Assurance evaluation campaign was conducted within Cameroon's State Universities during the 2025 academic year. The data collected from the 64 targeted Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) pertained to the 2023/2024 academic year. The aforementioned evaluation campaign was conducted according to an established methodology that yielded conclusive result.

The adopted methodology is divided into four (4) stages: 1. The Development and validation of a new evaluation framework; 2) The evaluation mission; 3) The re-evaluation; and 4) The data analysis and ranking.

I.1) The Development and Validation of the 2025 Evaluation Framework

The evaluation framework administered to the Institutions was developed by MINESUP and adopted by mutual agreement with the Heads of Institutions during a validation seminar held in May 2024 at the National Advanced School of Engineering (Polytechnic) of the University of Yaounde I.

I.2) The Evaluation Mission

From June 9 to July 31, 2025, by decision of the Minister of State, Minister of Higher Education, a mission was conducted across 68 public Higher Education Institutions to evaluate university governance. To this end, ten (10) evaluators were appointed by the Minister of State/MINE-SUP and assigned to the ten (10) State Universities: (Bamenda, Bertoua, Buea, Douala, Dschang, Ebolowa, Maroua, Ngaoundere, Yaounde I, and Yaounde II). This mission was part of the effort to entrench a quality-oriented culture within Cameroon's Higher Education sub-sector, aiming for the progressive alignment of national HEIs with international quality standards.

I.3) The Re-evaluation

"Quality is not declared; it is proven"—an expression that serves as the foundation for the work of quality assurance professionals. As such, the re-evaluation consisted of verifying the evidence provided by the Institutions during the initial evaluation mission, as well as considering supplementary documents from late-submitting institu-

tions that had been granted an extension. This process resulted in the awarding of a score based on the total points obtained following the re-evaluation meeting. Whenever the discrepancy between the initial evaluation score and the re-evaluation score was ten (10) points or more, a third evaluation was required to determine the final score.

I.4) The Data Analysis and Ranking

The analysis of the results made it possible to identify the outcomes for each Institution by observing their respective strengths and weaknesses; this process led to the formulation of recommendations aimed at improving quality within the evaluated establishments. The ranking itself was made per institution, per University, per type of Institution (Faculties, Professional Schools, etc.), and per category (Teaching, Research, Campus Life, etc.) based on the total points obtained.

II- RESULTS OF THE 2025 QUALITY ASSURANCE EVALUATION IN HEIs, 2025

II.1) General Performance of Institutions in 2025

A total of 68 public Higher Education institutions were evaluated in 2025, of which 37 were assessed using Evaluation Framework No. 1 and 31 using Evaluation Framework No. 2. The Institutions evaluated under Framework No. 1 are distributed as follows: 9 for the University of Bamenda, 8 for the University of Buea, 5 for the University of Douala, 1 for the University of Ebolowa, 2 for the University of Maroua, 7 for the University of Ngaoundere, 4 for the University of

Yaounde I, and 1 for the University of Yaounde II (Table 1). The Institutions evaluated under Framework No. 2 are distributed as follows: 3 for the University of Bamenda, 2 for the University of Buea, 6 for the University of Douala, 6 for the University of Dschang, 4 for the University of Maroua, 4 for the University of Ngaoundere, 2 for the University of Yaounde 1, and 4 for the University of Yaounde 2 (Table 2).

Table 3 shows that the Faculty of Economics and Management of the University of Maroua is ranked first out of the 37 institutions evaluated under Framework No. 1, with a quality assurance implementation rate of 87.4%, followed by the Faculty of Law and Political Science of the same university (83.5%).

Table 4 shows that the University Institute of Technology of the University of Douala and the National Advanced School of Engineering of the University of Maroua lead the ranking of the 31 institutions evaluated under Framework No. 2. Both institutions recorded a quality assurance implementation rate of 99.40%.

Overall, 57 out of the 68 institutions evaluated, representing 83.82% of university institutions, obtained a score greater than or equal to 50% (Table 5). This result indicates that, on average, the implementation of the Quality Assurance Policy is visible in 84% of State Higher Education Institutions in Cameroon, using the 2023/2024 academic year as the reference period.

The low scores of most institutions that failed to reach the average are due to several reasons, including:

- Human resource issues: specifically the neglect of living and working conditions for lecturers, students, and support staff, as the case may be.
- Communication issues: notably a low tendency to produce research materials (Institutional reviews or journals, etc.).
- Managerial issues: involving the lack of self-assessment mechanisms within the institution, extending to the failure to appoint a Quality Assurance focal point.
- Archiving issues: with supporting documents being non-existent or frequently backdated.
- Strategic issues: characterised by a lack of long-term managerial vision.

II.2) Classification by type of institution

In order to better understand the performance of public higher education institutions, it was deemed necessary to group them by affinity-based categories.

II.2.1) FALSH, FLSH, FSE, FA affinity-based category

Regarding the **FALSH, FLSH, FSE, FA** affinity-based category, it is worth noting with satisfaction that all institutions evaluated within this category—using both Framework No. 1 and Framework No. 2—achieved a rate exceeding 50%. This reflects the effective implementation of the quality assurance policy within these types of institutions (Table 6). With a 80.8% QA implementation rate, the FSE of the University of Ngaoundere (ranked 4th nationally) holds 1st place in this category of institutions evaluated under Framework No. 1. Meanwhile, the FALSH of the University of Maroua (85.7% QA implementation rate) holds 1st place among the institutions in this category evaluated under Framework No. 2 (Table 6).

II.2.2) FSEG, FSEGA and FSMS affinity-based category

Regarding the FSEG, FSEGA and FSMS affinity-based category, it should be noted that all institutions evaluated within this category—using both Framework No. 1 and Framework No. 2—achieved a rate exceeding 50% (with the exception of the FSMS of the University of Buea, which has a 34% QA implementation rate). This reflects the effective implementation of the quality assurance policy within these types of institutions (Table 7). With a 87.4% QA implementation rate, the FSEG of the University of Maroua (ranked 1st nationally) holds 1st place in this category of institutions evaluated under Framework No. 1. Meanwhile, the FSEG of the University of Yaounde II (90.5% QA implementation rate) holds 1st place among the institutions in this category evaluated under Framework No. 2 (Table 7).

II.2.3) FSJP, FLPS affinity-based category

Regarding the **FSJP, FLPS affinity-based category**, it should be noted that 3 out of 6 institutions evaluated within this category—using both Framework No. 1 and Framework No. 2—recorded a QA implementation rate of less than 50%. This reflects the slow implementation of the quality assurance policy within these types of institutions (Table 8). With a 83.5% QA implementation rate, the FSJP of the University of Maroua (ranked 2nd nationally) holds 1st place in this category of institutions evaluated under Framework No. 1. Meanwhile, the FSJP of the University of Ngaoundere (63.8% QA implementation rate) holds 1st place among the institutions in this category evaluated under Framework No. 2 (Table 8).

The institutions of this university perform well in the domains of teaching and learning (67.8%) and management (54.5%).

Some weaknesses are noted in the other domains, such as self-assessment, research policy, and corporate social responsibility, where performance levels remain below average (Table 13).

II.3.8.2 The University of Ngaoundere (Framework No. 2)

II.3.9 The University of Yaounde 1

The University of Yaounde 1 (Framework No. 1)

Regarding the institutions of the University of Yaounde I evaluated under Framework No. 1, the implementation of Quality Assurance proves to be good (67.25%) (Table 27).

These institutions record high scores in the domains of teaching and learning (71%) and social responsibility (63.68%). However, weaknesses in the domain of self-assessment need to be addressed.

II.3.9.2. The University of Yaounde 1 (Framework No. 2)

Regarding the institutions of the University of Yaounde I evaluated under Framework No. 2, the implementation of Quality Assurance proves to be average (54.6%) (Table 28).

These institutions record an acceptable score in the domains of teaching and learning (57%) and social responsibility (58.33%). However, weaknesses in the domains of self-assessment, research, and management need to be addressed.

II.3.10.1. The University of Yaounde 2 (Framework No. 1)

Regarding the FSJP (Faculty of Law and Political Science), which is the only institution of the University of Yaounde 2 to be evaluated under Framework No. 1, the implementation of Quality Assurance proves to be satisfactory (70.87%) (Table 29).

This institution records a very high score in the domains of teaching and learning (81.15%) and management (72.72%). However, weaknesses in the domains of self-assessment, research, and social responsibility need to be addressed.

III- FINAL RANKING OF UNIVERSITIES IN 2025

The ranking of State Universities reveals the following observations:

- An overall improvement in the performance of State Universities between 2023 and 2025. The implementation rate of the quality assurance policy has risen from 55.51% in 2023 to 66.79% in 2025. This global performance further consolidates the achievements of State Universities in terms of quality assurance, although significant efforts remain to be made.
- A decline in performance for the University of Douala, whose quality assurance policy implementation rate dropped from 71.69% to 69.21%.
- An increase of over 10 points in the performance of certain universities from 2023 to 2025, notably the Universities of Bamenda, Ngaoundere, Maroua, and Yaounde 2.
- An increase of less than 10 points in the performance of some universities from 2023 to 2025, notably the Universities of Buea and Yaounde 1.

It should also be noted that six (6) out of seven (7) universities improved their performance compared to 2023 (Table 31).

The ranking per domain of evaluation makes it possible to determine the main strengths and weaknesses of each university individually. For the sake of objectivity, this matter should be addressed by categorising the universities according to their respective evaluation frameworks.

In general, regardless of the evaluation framework, the institutions of the universities evaluated show performance levels above average across all domains. This result indicates a clear progression in the implementation of quality assurance within our universities since 2023 (Tables 32 and 33).

IV- CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

IV.1- CONCLUSIONS

1. 1- It should be noted that the quality of Higher Education institutions in State Universities improved significantly between 2023 and 2025, with the implementation rate of the quality assurance policy rising from 55.51% to 66.79%.
- 2.
3. 2- Seven (7) out of eight (8) universities are effectively experiencing this progressive trend, marked by a qualitative leap in terms of quality assurance.
- 4.
5. 3- In these universities, quality assurance performance is remarkable across all domains of evaluation.
- 6.
7. 4- Technology and technical-oriented institutions (IUTs, ENSPs) demonstrate the best quality assurance performance within State Universities.
- 8.
9. 5- The security crisis prevailing in the South-West and North-West regions is negatively impacting the implementation of the quality assurance policy at the Universities of Buea and Bamenda.

IV.2. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. 1- Organise awareness-raising seminars to further encourage the practice of the quality approach within State Universities;

3. 2- Consider the creation of structures with financial autonomy within public Higher Education institutions, responsible for the effective implementation of the quality assurance policy;
- 4.
5. 3- Issue a formal warning to all institutions resistant to external evaluation of the quality approach, such as the Faculty of Science of the University of Yaounde 1, the Faculty of Arts, Letters and Social Sciences of the University of Dschang, the Faculty of Law and Political Science of the University of Dschang, and the Institute of Fine Arts of the University of Dschang;

7. 4- Draft a statutory instrument establishing the practice of annual self-assessment within public Higher Education institutions.
